Be it the brilliant spring blossoms, canvas of colors from fall foliage, or wintry white slopes, Lake Kuzuryū's bountiful natural surroundings create a beautiful panorama regardless of the season. Hakogase Bridge, known as the Bridge of Dreams, provides a stunning view of this man-made lake.

Fall brings its Kōyō Festival to the Kuzuryū Recreation Area, which features stage events, local produce and products, and the many flavors of fall. From the outskirts of Ono City to Kakigashima stretches the Kuzuryū Gorge, a ravine carved into the Kadobara diorite rocks from years of erosion by the river's strong currents. In fall it

bursts into brilliant colors, and in spring the peach blossoms along its banks give it a soft glow of pink and white, leading locals to call it a Shangri-la. The gorge is also the site of many tree plantings, making it a local mecca of environmentally conscious volunteers.
